## **FAQs**

**Question:** **What is A Woman's Work?**

**Answer:** A Woman's Work is a unique funding source for women in the St. Vrain Valley who need assistance with immediate needs that cannot be met by other sources.

**Question:** **What does A Woman's Work do?**

**Answer:** A Woman's Work provides resources for a wide variety of needs including child care, housing, transportation, medical needs and more. AWW assists women who live or work in the St. Vrain Valley for at least 90 days. A Woman's Work asks only that the recipient performs an act of kindness in return.

**Question:** **How did A Woman's Work get started?**

**Answer:** It was a question asked by a small group of women in 2003: What happens to women in our community when they are met with financial crisis and there is no help available from family and friends? The answer, they found, was disappointing --- there was little support available to many women who found themselves in that situation. This group of women took matters into their own hands and set a goal of finding 100 women in 100 days who would donate \$100. They met their goal in 13 days, and A Woman's Work began.

**Question:** **Why does A Woman's Work focus on helping women?**

**Answer:** Research shows that social investment in women reduces poverty, raises productivity and accelerates economic growth. Support for women benefits families and strengthens entire communities.

**Question:** **How is A Woman's Work funded?**

**Answer:** More than 80% of our funds come from individual donors in our local community. The other 20% comes from private grants, corporate sponsorship and special event revenue.

**Question:** **What can I do to help A Woman's Work?**
